

Visibility & Mobility Module for Ph.D. students

For research trips:

a. Positive opinion of the supervisor, the opinion should indicate the role of the doctoral student in the publication/presentation: 10 points, negative opinion or lack thereof: 0 points

b. Description of the doctoral student's achievements to date: max 10 points

Possibility to present one selected publication published (or accepted for publication) during study in Doctoral School. If the doctoral student is a corresponding author: 8 points, if the doctoral student is the first author: 6 points (this score is not added), and additionally max 2 points if the number of coauthors is one; otherwise, proportional to the number of coauthors

In the absence of publication, one oral presentation at an international scientific conference presented by a doctoral student may be given (max 2 points), and additionally 2 points if the number of coauthors is one, in other cases - 0 points.

If a doctoral student applies for more than one form of support in the same module, they cannot present the same publication/presentation for each module (one publication = one form of support).

c. Specification of the purpose of the trip and presentation of the research plan approved by the host institution (max 5 points), it is mandatory to specify how the trip will implement at least one of the pillars of the 4*I principle in ID UJ (max 2 points): total max 7 points

Additionally (max 3 points):

Information on all research trips (internships, study trips to research centers, mobility grants, but not conference trips or commercial training), regardless of the source of funding, carried out while studying at the doctoral school or a statement that such trips did not take place. If a list of trips is presented, the score is inversely proportional to the number of trips and their duration. In calculating the proportional number of points, all applications submitted in given application round that meet the formal requirements are taken into account. Max 3 points in the case of no trips or for one trip not longer than 1 week.

For conferences, the doctoral student must be a presenting person (according to the regulations: active participation in the conference):

a. Positive opinion of the supervisor: 10 points, negative opinion or lack thereof: 0 points

b. Description of the doctoral student's achievements to date: max 10 points

Possibility to present one selected publication published (or accepted for publication) during study in Doctoral School. If the doctoral student is a corresponding author: 8 points, if the doctoral student is the first author: 6 points (this score is not added), and additionally max 2 points if the number of coauthors is one; otherwise, inversely proportional to the number of coauthors

In the absence of publication, one oral presentation at an international scientific conference presented by a doctoral student may be given (max 2 points), and additionally 2 points if the number of coauthors is one, in other cases - 0 points.

If a doctoral student applies for more than one form of support in the same module, they cannot present the same publication/presentation for each module (one publication = one form of support).

c. Description of the purpose of the trip and connection with the doctoral dissertation (max 3 points), it is obligatory to specify how the trip will implement at least one of the pillars of the 4*I principle in ID UJ (max 2 points): in total max 5 points

Additionally (max 5 points)

For international conferences taking place outside of Poland:

Presentation of an abstract accepted as an oral presentation - max 5 points

Presentation of an abstract accepted as a poster - max 3 points

For international conferences taking place in Poland

presentation of an abstract accepted as an oral presentation - max 3 points

Presentation of an abstract accepted as a poster - max 1 point

Funding for open access costs is not provided.

Skills Development & Engagement Module for Ph.D. students

a. Positive opinion of the supervisor, the opinion should indicate the role of the doctoral student in the publication / presentation: 10 points, negative opinion or lack thereof: 0 points

b. Description of the doctoral student's achievements to date - max 10 points

The doctoral student may present all additional (optional, facultative) courses in which they participated (completed and in progress) upon admission to the Doctoral School (also applies to language courses). Note: if the doctoral student completed only two compulsory panels, then one of the optional panels is not shown at this point, for one compulsory panel – two facultative are not counted in. Other forms of activity realized outside the Doctoral School are also included, provided that the doctoral student presents a relevant certificate. In the case of ongoing courses, confirmation by the teacher that the doctoral student attends the classes (and not only that they are enrolled in) is required.

c. description of the purpose for which the doctoral student takes part in the competition, mandatory points are given below (max 10 points):

- planned activity;
- description of acquired competences and skills;
- linking this activity with a doctoral dissertation;
- the impact of acquired competences and skills on professional development after completing the doctorate

Excellence Module – applies to 1st and 2nd degree awards

Awards for publications from the list of MEiN journals scored for 200 (1st degree award) and 140 (2nd degree award), in accordance with Rector's Ordinance No. 14 dated Jan 28th 2022. If number of applications exceeds number of possible prizes, the ranking will be determined by awarding:

8 points, if the doctoral student is the corresponding author (excluding cases where there are more than two corresponding authors);

6 points if the doctoral student is the first author (this score is not added)

and additionally max 2 points, if the number of coauthors is one, in other cases inversely proportional to the number of coauthors.
