

Yukihiro Ozaki obtained his Ph.D. from Osaka University in 1978. He was a professor in the School of Science and Technology, Kwansai Gakuin University until 2018. He was a Vice President of Kwansai Gakuin University from 2013 to 2018. Currently, Ozaki is a professor emeritus and a university fellow, Kwansai Gakuin University, a guest professor, Kobe University, and a guest principal researcher of RIKEN. Ozaki has long been involved in the studies of vibrational spectroscopy including Raman, infrared, and near-infrared (NIR) spectroscopy. He has also been very active for far-ultraviolet spectroscopy studies. Ozaki received many prestigious awards and distinctions including Doctor Honoris Causa, Jagiellonian University, Poland (2016) and Doctor Honoris Causa, University of Wroclaw, Poland (2019). He is a fellow of Royal Society of Chemistry. The Chemical Society of Japan Award (2017). The Medal with Purple Ribbon from Japanese Emperor (2018). Pittsburg Spectroscopy Award (2019). Medal of Ioannes Marcus Marci (2022). He received The Order of the Sacred Treasure, Gold Rays with Neck Ribbon from the Japanese government this year.
